Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

BM Enterprise Inc.– Seafood Processing and Cold Storage Facility located at Guyana Fisheries Wharf, Area ‘K’ Houston, Georgetown.

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. The proposed site for the facility has been deemed appropriate for the activity by the Central Housing and Planning Permission (CH&PA) and it is not located within close proximity of similar activities that may contribute to any cumulative impacts.
2. Effluent from the facility will be treated via the LAMOR containerised floatation system, which is optimal for removing fish grease, oil residuals, nutrients, and other solid particles.
3. Wastes from the facility will be reused and disposed of via methods approved by the Agency. These methods include reuse as animal feed and disposal at an approved dumpsite.
4. Odour from the facility will be minimized through proper waste practices, which would include:
 - Disinfection of the facility before and after operation.
 - Constant removal of all seafood waste (scales, guts, head etc.) and solid waste from site to prevent accumulation. Seafood waste will also be stored in a designated area to reduce odour emissions into the environment.
5. Noise and vibrations from the operation of compressors and generators on site will be mitigated by:
 - Ensuring that they are equipped with the required mufflers/silencers;



- The establishment on an impervious surface to reduce vibration emissions into the environment.
6. The project is considered as a medium-scale operation. Therefore, it is recommended that an Environmental Management Plan be developed, conducted and implemented in accordance with the guidelines set out by the EPA prior to the issuance of an Environmental Authorisation (EA). This document will be reviewed and approved by the EPA once all potential impacts are accounted for and measures of mitigation are executable and effective.
