Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Caribbean Concrete (Guyana) Inc. (CCGI), Asphalt Plant and Concrete Batching Plant with Aggregate Storage Facility - Sublot 14D, Block 'P', Crown Land, West Bank Demerara.

The EPA has determined that this project will not have a significant impact on the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. Impacts from dust, gaseous emissions, and odour will be moderate, short term, and mitigable. Baghouse filters and wet scrubbers will be installed, with water spraying, covered stockpiles, covered trucks, and regular equipment maintenance implemented.
2. Impacts from noise and vibration will be low, medium term, and localised. Controls will include restricted working hours (08:00h to 17:00h), regular equipment maintenance, and compliance with GNBS noise limit standards.
3. Impacts to water quality will be low, short term, and mitigable. Fuel will be stored in a bunded area, stockpiles kept away from drainages, and wastewater managed. A sediment pond and septic system will be constructed, with spill prevention measures implemented.
4. Impacts from solid and hazardous waste will be minor, short term, and mitigable. Waste will be segregated with regular collection and disposal at an approved landfill. Hazardous waste will be stored in sealed containers and bunded areas, and disposed of by an authorised facility.
