Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Cheddi Jagan International Airport Corporation (CJIAC) – Construction of the New Arrival Terminal Building – Timehri, East Bank Demerara, Region 4.

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. Impacts from particulate matter and gaseous emissions from the construction activities and the operation of heavy-duty machinery will be moderate, short-term, and mitigable. Potential impacts will be mitigated by frequent ground wetting, ensuring trucks are covered when transporting aggregates, and machinery will be serviced regularly to minimise harmful gas emissions.
2. Impacts of noise and vibration will be moderate and periodic. Noise emissions will occur during construction from equipment and heavy-duty machinery and are not expected to exceed 90 decibels (GNBS Standards). Noise intensive activities will be conducted only during the daytime.
3. Hazardous and non-hazardous waste generated will not pose a significant risk to human health and the environment. An authorised waste disposal service will manage and dispose non-hazardous waste during construction in accordance with the Hazardous Waste Management Regulations, 2000.
4. Stormwater and sedimentation impact during construction will be localised, short-term and mitigable. The impact on surface water quality will not be significant since there will be no direct discharge into waterways.
