Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

DROMOS Mining and Construction Inc. (DROMINC), Construction and Operation Asphalt Plant with Aggregate Storage, Fuel Storage, Workshop, Well and Construction of Buildings – Plot 'DRO', Portion of Tract 'X' between Madewini Creek and Kuru Kururu Residential Lots, Eastern Side of the Soesdyke-Linden Highway, East Bank Demerara

The EPA has determined that this project will not have a significant impact on the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. Impacts from dust, gaseous emissions, and odour will be moderate, short term, and mitigable. The plant is equipped with a baghouse filter system, with water spraying, covered stockpiles, covered trucks, paved internal roads, and regular equipment maintenance implemented.
2. Impacts from noise and vibration will be low, medium term, and localised. Measures include will include controlled working hours, regular equipment maintenance, and compliance with GNBS noise limit.
3. Impacts to water quality will be low, short term, and mitigable. Fuel and bitumen will be stored in bunded areas, stockpiles kept away from drainages, and wastewater managed through a septic system. Spill prevention measures and spill kits will be implemented.
4. Impacts from solid and hazardous waste will be minor, short term, and mitigable. Waste will be segregated with regular collection and disposal. Hazardous waste will be stored in sealed containers and bunded areas, with disposal managed by an authorised facility.
