Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Guycrete Inc. (Precast Concrete Drain Manufacturing Facility)

The EPA has determined that this project, for the following reasons, will not significantly affect the environment and is, therefore, exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA).

1. The proposed project site is not located within an environmentally sensitive area and does not contain any special environmental features, critical habitats, or species of conservation concern.
2. Adequate mitigation measures to control potential impacts to soil, water, air quality, and noise levels have been outlined in the project's application for Environmental Authorization.
3. Air emissions, including dust from cement handling, batching, and vehicle movement, will be controlled through dust suppression techniques, covered storage of fine materials, and regulation of vehicle speeds within the facility.
4. Noise impacts from machinery and operational activities will be minimized by restricting operations to approved working hours and maintaining equipment in accordance with manufacturer specifications.
5. Potential impacts to surface water and soil from concrete wash water, sediment runoff, and chemical use will be managed through the establishment of a designated concrete washout area, implementation of sediment control measures, proper storage of chemicals, and spill prevention and response procedures.
