Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for each of the following proposed project:

Guyana Shore Base – Maintenance & Mechanical Facility at Tract Gil 2 and AM 1, Rome, East Bank Demerara.

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for this decision are as follows:

- 1) The project will not be located within an environmentally sensitive area, i.e., it is not located in an area having special environmental attributes that require special care or rare ecosystems or habitats with species at risk.
- 2) Air and water quality will not be significantly impacted, given that Volatile Organic Compounds and particulate matter, including vapors generated during processes like tank filling and emptying, will be directed to processing units such as sealed containers and tanks. This will not only recover valuable substances, preventing product loss, but will also reduce air pollution.
- 3) Soil and Water quality will not be significantly impacted, given that the waste oil will be stored on an impervious surface within a secondary bund.
- 4) All vehicles and equipment will be maintained or serviced according to the manufacturer's specifications in an effort to reduce noise emission levels.
- 5) The application and project summary submitted outlined adequate mitigation measures for soil, water, air & noise emissions from the project.
