### **Notice to the Public**

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the applications for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed projects:

- 1. Mr. Rudolph Lakha – (Logging Concession) at Dem 26/08, located at Left Bank Kamuni River, Right Bank Kuruberri Creek, Left and Right Banks Mora Creek, Right Bank Boerasirie.**
- 2. Mr. Rudolph Lakha – (Logging Concession) Dem 15/13, at Left Bank Boerasirie River: Left Bank Yamparri River; Right Bank South Durabanna Creek.**
- 3. Mr. Ragnauth Persaud - (Logging Concession) ESS 74/11, at Left, Right Bank Cuyuni River, Left Bank Stop-off Creek.**
- 4. Mr. Rabindranauth Prasad - (Logging Concession) BCE 10/93, at Left Bank Corentyne River, Left Bank Mapenna River.**

The EPA has determined that these projects will not significantly affect the environment, and are therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for EPA's decision include:

1. To minimize impacts on the environment including biodiversity, these projects will implement harvesting practices in accordance with the Code of Practice for Forest Operations and the guidelines set by the Guyana Forestry Commission (GFC), such as:
  - a. **Selective Logging:** careful selection of individual trees to harvest and leaving the majority of the forest intact; and
  - b. **Reduced Impact Logging (RIL):** directional felling of trees for least disturbance to forest, minimal damage to surrounding trees and soil.
2. Noise and vibration in forest concessions, stemming primarily from logging activities, machinery, and transportation will have environmental impacts, particularly on wildlife. These impacts will be mitigated by:
  - a. Limiting operations to non-critical periods;
  - b. Scheduling noisy activities when they are least likely to disturb wildlife e.g. outside of breeding or nesting seasons;
  - c. Limiting or avoiding operating at night;
  - d. Regular maintenance of machinery; and
  - e. Enforcing speed limits for vehicles in forest concessions.



**3. Waste produced in the operations will be managed by**

- a. Separation into organic, inorganic, hazardous, and recyclable wastes;
- b. Composting organic waste (e.g., food scraps, plant material) to produce natural fertilizer in a designated area away from water sources;
- c. Repurposing wood waste ( sawdust , wood chips, offcuts) for compost, land filling or as fuel.
- d. Safely store hazardous materials, such as waste oil in labelled containers and reuse waste oil for chainsaws.
