



Environmental Protection Agency Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Mr. Ramesh Chatrapaul Seepersaud - Ramesh Auto Blocks (Block Making), to be situated at Lot 36, Alness Village, Corentyne, Berbice.

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for EPA's decision include:

1. The proposed site for the facility has been deemed appropriate for the activity by the local NDC, and it is not located within proximity of similar activities that may contribute to any cumulative impacts.
2. Air emissions will not have significant impacts on air quality as they will be localised, short-term, and mitigated through routine maintenance of equipment and the application of wet suppression systems.
3. Noise emissions are expected to be within the GNBS limits since the power generator and other noise-producing equipment will be operating within enclosures and with mufflers/silencers attached.
4. Water Quality will not be significantly impacted since the facility will install sediment traps, and oils, fuels and chemicals will be stored in a designated, leak-proof containment area within secondary containment.
5. Hazardous and non-hazardous waste will be contained to reduce adverse risks to human health and the environment. All hazardous waste will be appropriately stored, disposed of, and/or reused in keeping with the Agency's Hazardous Waste Guidelines. All non-hazardous waste will be disposed of by existing means.
