### **Notice to the Public**

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

#### **RZND Concrete Building Materials Co. Inc.- Concrete Batching Plant – Lot 51 First Dam, Garden of Eden, East Bank Demerara**

The EPA has determined that this project will not have a significant impact on the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. Impacts from particulate matter and gaseous emissions from the concrete batching plant will be moderate, short term, and mitigable. Measures to protect air quality will include regular water sprays during dry periods, and temporary covers for exposed soil and stockpiles. The batching plant is equipped with a shed and partially enclosed; and is fitted with a dust collection system whose captured material will be periodically removed and disposed of. Vehicle movements will be minimised, speed limits enforced on site, wheel wash will be provided at exits, and routine air quality monitoring will ensure concentrations remain within WHO guidelines.
2. Impacts of noise and vibration will be moderate, medium term, and localised but mitigable. Sources will be vehicle and machinery movements and operational equipment. Generators are fitted with enclosures and mufflers, and activities will be confined to stipulated working hours.
3. Impacts to water and effluent will be negligible, short term, and mitigable. Concrete washout will be captured in a settling pond prior to discharge. Stormwater will be treated in accordance with GNBS standards and the Water Quality Regulations 2000.
