



## **Environmental Protection Agency Notice to the Public**

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

***Triple J David Farmstead –Poultry & Pig Rearing & Processing Facility located at Tract ‘JD’ of Lot 5 being portion of State Land situate on the Western Side, Soesdyke Linden Highway, Left Bank Marakai Creek, right bank Hauraruni River, right bank Demerara River.***

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. The proposed agricultural facility is considered suitable for development due to its official designation for agricultural use by the Guyana Lands and Surveys Commission and is located approximately 170 meters away from sensitive receptor (Marakai Creek), thereby reducing the potential for environmental nuisances.
2. The project will have built-in mitigation measures for water pollution control, including effluent containment and wastewater treatment systems, designed to significantly reduce potential environmental impacts.
3. The facility will incorporate sustainable waste management practices, including conversion of organic waste into bio-fertilizer and strict husbandry controls (dry litter management, leak prevention, and immediate carcass removal) to minimize odour, pathogens, and overall waste generation while promoting resource recovery.
