Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Well-Built Construction Services, Mobile Concrete Batching Plant and Workshop - 615 Block XXIX, Garden of Eden, East Bank Demerara.

The EPA has determined that this project will not have a significant impact on the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. Impacts from dust and gaseous emissions will be moderate, short term, and mitigable. The compound is paved and a dust screen will be implemented, with stockpiles kept at the required height. Vehicles and machinery will be subject to regular maintenance.
2. Impacts from noise and vibration will be low, medium term, and localised. Controls will include limited working hours, regular equipment maintenance, and compliance with GNBS noise limit standards.
3. Impacts to water quality will be low, short term, and mitigable. Fuel will be banded, aggregates and laydown materials will be kept away from drainages. Spill prevention measures and maintenance protocols will be implemented to prevent contamination.
4. Impacts from solid and hazardous waste will be minor, short term, and mitigable. Waste will be segregated with regular collection and disposal at the approved landfill. Hazardous waste will be stored in appropriate containers and banded areas, with disposal managed in accordance with the Hazardous Waste Regulations 2000.
