Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

MOISTURE DENSITY TESTING AT 3KM WISROC, LINDEN-MABURA ROAD, REGION 10

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. The facility's comprehensive adherence to the ALARA principle, incorporating time, distance, shielding, and security measures, effectively minimizes the impact of using radioactive sources, ensuring a secure operational environment.
2. Stringent and clear security measures, including restricted access, demarcation barriers, and surveillance, are prioritized at the facility to prevent exposure.
3. Radioactive waste (Disused sources) will be deemed obsolete if they are no longer operational or meeting operational requirements, and will be returned to their respective manufacturers or suppliers outside of Guyana.
4. Water quality remains unaffected, as the gauges do not generate any effluent.
5. Steps to reduce greenhouse gases from transportation, like better performance and speed limit compliance, are enforced to minimize the facility's impact on air quality.
6. Expected vehicle noise during operation should be low-moderate due to optimized performance and speed control, reducing noise pollution effectively
