Mr. Deolall Pooran, trading and operating under the name, “Davo’s Lumber Yard” hereinafter referred to as the “Permit Holder”, is hereby authorised in accordance with the Environmental Protection Act, Cap 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000, to operate a Lumber Yard (With Processing), located at Lot 20DD Industrial Site, Eccles, East Bank Demerara, hereinafter referred to as the “Project”, in the manner indicated in the Renewal Application submitted on December 01, 2020, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein and any existing or forthcoming regulations made under the said Environmental Protection Act and/or any other applicable laws, best practices, standards, guidelines and codes of practice or other regulatory instruments relevant to this project.

This is a Renewal of the Operation Permit, Reference #20030127-DLYOO, which was issued on December 15, 2014 and expired on November 30, 2019.

The Permit Holder, His Servants, Agents and/or Sub-Contractors shall comply with the following Terms and Conditions:

1.0 OPERATION

- 1.1 Notify the Agency in writing and obtain its approval for **ANY** proposed changes in operation of the Lumber Yard (With Processing) at least **fourteen (14) days** before making the change. The notification shall

contain a **description of the proposed change in operation**. It is not necessary to make such a notification if **an Application to vary** this Permit has been made and the Application contains a description of the proposed change. In this condition '**change in operation**' means a change in the nature or functioning, or an extension, or any additional installation, which may have consequences for the environment. "Changes to operation" may include but is not be limited to the following:

- a. Changes in construction, structure, or layout of the facility, plant or building;
 - b. Installation of new and/or changes to equipment, machine, apparatus, mechanism, system or technology serving the facility or operation;
 - c. Changes in any technology used or installed at the facility from which effluent is discharged.
 - d. Any other varying provisions as prescribed by *Regulation 20(3)* of the *Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations*.
- 1.2 Ensure that the transport of logs and/or lumber to and from your Project site is done in a manner that would prevent adverse impacts to public safety.
 - 1.3 Ensure that trucks are equipped with the necessary reflecting signage to warn the public of impending danger of parked/moving trucks with lumber on the public thoroughfares.
 - 1.4 Ensure that the transportation of lumber to and from your operation does not impede traffic on roadways. Lumber must be contained within the boundaries of the project site.
 - 1.5 Ensure that adequate provisions are in place for ingress and egress to the site. **Storage of lumber is prohibited on the road reserve unless specified otherwise in writing by the Neighbourhood Democratic Council.**
 - 1.6 Maintain suitable storage facilities (racks and shelves) for all items. These facilities must be so organised that free and adequate passage is maintained. Over-crowding of the lumber yard and/or over-stacking of lumber are prohibited.
 - 1.7 Load and offload lumber between 06:00h to 18:00h to minimise disturbance to residents.
 - 1.8 Maintain a valid Fire Safety Certificate from the Guyana Fire Service. All firefighting equipment must be maintained and serviced on a regular basis.

The Fire Certificate must be presented to officers of the Agency upon request, during compliance inspections and in Annual Reports.

- 1.9 Provide adequate fire protection measures such as fire extinguishers and sand buckets in accordance with the Guyana Fire Service's approval.

2.0 WASTE MANAGEMENT

- 2.1 Comply with the provisions of the Environmental Protection (Litter Enforcement) Regulations, 2013, where applicable.
- 2.2 Maintain good house-keeping, sanitary and hygienic practices. The aesthetic quality of your surroundings must be maintained at all times.
- 2.3 Promote proper solid waste management practices at Project site. Covered garbage receptacles must be placed at strategic locations, both inside and outside the Facility. All solid waste collected in these receptacles must be disposed of at an approved waste disposal site.
- 2.4 Maintain a dust containment bin with the capacity to store approximately seventy-five (75%) percent of all wood waste (sawdust and shavings, etc.) generated during the peak working season/s during the year of operation.
- 2.5 Dispose of any additional sawdust, strips, wood shaving, wood ends and wood skins at a designated site and do not allow waste to accumulate on site.
 - 2.5.1 In event of sawdust, strips, shaving, wood skins and wood ends accumulating on site; ensure the heap is kept at a height not exceeding two (2) meters at a designated site.
- 2.6 Ensure wood waste such as sawdust, shaving, wood ends, etc. are recovered and appropriately disposed of at an approved location away from waterways or otherwise reused. Reuse options include but are not limited to the following:
 - i. Poultry bedding;
 - ii. Mulching for gardens, highway verges, and agriculture
 - iii. Wood pellets
 - iv. Fuel briquettes
 - v. Landfill where practical.

- 2.7 Maintain septic tank system for employees on site at all times. The septic tank should not be located within 1.5 meters of a building or property boundary and should be accessible for cleaning and de-sludging. Any modification to the Septic tanks must be in accordance with the Guyana National Bureau of Standards (GNBS) *Code of Practice for the Design and Construction of Septic Tanks and Associated Secondary Treatment and Disposal Systems*.
- 2.8 Maintain an adequate drainage system around the facility.

3.0 AIR QUALITY & NOISE MANAGEMENT

- 3.1 Comply with the applicable provisions of the Environmental Protection (Air Quality) Regulations, 2000 and the Environmental Protection (Noise Management) Regulations, 2000.
- 3.2 Comply with the Guyana National Bureau of Standards (GNBS) *Guidelines for Noise Emission into the Environment* at a distance of 15 metres (50 feet) from the source or property boundary, whichever is closer; taking care not to exceed the limits below:

Industrial Limits: 100 dB (Daytime Limits 06:00 h-18:00 h)

- 3.3 Ensure all equipment and machinery are placed on foundations properly designed to ensure effective damping of vibrations.
- 3.4 Implement all possible measures such as ensuring equipment is serviced and operated according to manufacturer's recommendations to minimise the impact of sound levels on the environment.
- 3.5 Take all reasonable precautions to prevent wood dust from becoming airborne.
- 3.6 Reduce the speed limits during dry periods to minimise dust generation on routes traversed by vehicles.

4.0 EMPLOYEES AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

- 4.1 Ensure all employees/third party contractors are aware of the Conditions of the Operation Permit - Renewed and provide training on good environmental management practices. Prepare and maintain a training file for employees, which should be available upon officers' request during Compliance Inspections.
- 4.2 All employees must be equipped with and trained in the use of protective equipment to fit their job specification such as hi-visibility vests, respirators, hard hats, gloves, and appropriate footwear and ensure appropriate utilisation of these gears. A log for the distribution of Personal

Protective Equipment to employees must be maintained. Evidence of distribution log must be presented to officers of the Agency upon request during compliance inspections.

- 4.3 A first aid kit equipped according to the Guyana Red Cross standards must be located on site at times. Additionally, communication and transportation systems must be in place to respond to emergencies.
- 4.4 Ensure all employees are trained in the use of fire extinguishers and firefighting protocol(s).

5.0 COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND REPORTING

- 5.1 Comply with any lawful directions given by the EPA from time-to-time in furtherance of the implementation of any international or other obligation for the environmental protection of Guyana.
- 5.2 Monitor the implementation of the conditions of this Permit, insofar as they involve adherence by your employees and all third parties under your direction.
- 5.3 Submit **Annual Reports** to the EPA on or before **March 31** every year on your compliance with this Permit.
- 5.4 Inform the Agency prior to or within **thirty (30) days** of any change of name or ownership of the operation.
- 5.5 Notify the Agency within **twenty-one (21) days** in event of death, bankruptcy, liquidation or receivership of the Permit Holder or if the Company becomes a party to an amalgamation.
- 5.6 Notify the EPA **within one (1) hour** of the occurrence of any environmental emergencies such as a sudden onset disaster, accident, natural, technological or human induced factors that cause or threaten to cause severe environmental damage as well as harm to human health or livelihood.
- 5.7 Report to the Agency of non-compliance with the Operation Permit (Renewed) as follows:
 - a. Within **twenty-four (24) hours** of the time the Permit Holder becomes aware of the non-compliance, the anticipated manner in which it may endanger human health or the environment.
 - b. Within **seventy-two (72) hours**, submit to the Agency a written report containing a description of the non-compliance,

its cause and the period of non-compliance including exact dates and time.

- c. Submit a written report to the Agency within **seventy-two (72) hours** indicating the reasons and the anticipated time it is expected to continue if the non-compliance has not been corrected.

6.0 INSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY/LIABILITIES

- 6.1 The EPA reserves the right to conduct regular inspections of the Permit Holder's operation as part of its monitoring and enforcement requirements under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- 6.2 The EPA reserves the right to review and/or amend the conditions and fees attached to this Permit, which also includes the review and/or amendment of Permit Fees in consideration of any changes in fee structure as determined by the Agency for projects of this nature.
- 6.3 The EPA shall have the right to cancel or suspend this Permit for breach of any of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 6.4 The Permit Holder shall conform to all terms and conditions under which this Permit is granted, and shall be liable for any loss or damage which arises from the project as a result of the Permit Holder's activities or breach of any term or condition of this Permit.
- 6.5 The Permit Holder shall, at all times, allow entry to the Permitted facility to any Officer designated by the EPA for the purposes of conducting inspections or any other legitimate business of the Agency. Pursuant to section 38 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, it is an offence to **assault, obstruct or hinder** an authorised person in the execution of his/her duty under the said Act or its Regulations and the Permit Holder shall be liable to penalties prescribed under paragraph (c) of the Fifth Schedule for doing so.
- 6.6 The Permit Holder shall adhere to the provisions of section 19(3) of the Environmental Protection Act Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, inclusive of his obligation to compensate any Party who suffers any loss or damage as a result of the attributed project, Laws of Guyana.
- 6.7 This Operation Permit (Renewed) is not the final consent; all relevant permissions must be obtained from other regulatory bodies for continued operation.

6.8 The Permit Holder, his Servants, Agents and/or Sub-Contractors shall be strictly jointly and severally liable as follows:

- a. For any activity that causes, or is likely to cause pollution of the environment, unless all reasonable and practicable measures were taken to prevent or minimise any resulting adverse effect, in accordance with Section 19(1) (a) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- b. For any activity which results in the discharge, release or entry into the environment of any contaminant in any amount, concentration or level in excess of that prescribed by the regulations or stipulated by this Permit, in accordance with Section 19(1) (b) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05 Laws of Guyana.
- c. The discharge or release of contaminants, such as wood wastes, sludge, wastewater, hydraulic fluids, lubricants, fuel, chemicals, hazardous materials or other wastes relative to the Project, which are not regulated herein, or permitted to be discharged herein, are strictly prohibited. Any such discharge or release shall be deemed a violation of Section 19(1) (a) and/or Section 19(1) (b) of the Environmental Protection Act.
- d. For the fulfilment of the obligations contained in Section 19(3) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, including, the duty to compensate any Party who suffers any loss or damage as a result of the project.
- e. For any material or serious environmental harm caused by pollution of the environment intentionally or recklessly in accordance with section 39 (1), (2), (3) and (4) of the Environmental Protection Act, 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- f. Any gross negligence or wilful misconduct resulting in serious risk, or adverse effects to the marine environment, biodiversity, protected species and natural habitat with respect to any release or discharge, spill, contaminant fluids, oil, or lubricants from any facilities permitted under this project.
- g. For the payment of all costs and expenses related to the assessment of damage and investigations required, as result of any pollution incidents attributable or likely to be attributable to the activity for which this Permit has been issued.

- 6.9 Should the Permit Holder contravene or is likely to contravene any condition of this Permit, the Agency (EPA) may serve on him an Enforcement Notice in accordance with Section 26 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 6.10 Where it appears to the Agency that the Permit Holder is engaged in any activity that may pose serious threat to natural resources or serious pollution of the Environment or any damage to public health, the Agency may issue to the Permit Holder a Prohibition Notice, which may include an order to immediately cease the offending activity, pursuant to Section 27 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 6.11 The Agency (EPA) shall notify the Permit Holder immediately of any written claim or notice sent by any complainant seeking loss or damage for negligence as a result of the Permit Holder's lack of due care and diligence.
- 6.12 The Permit Holder shall be liable of any gross negligence or willful misconduct caused by the Permit Holder, his Servants and/or Agents, to the biodiversity, protected species and natural habitat.
- 6.13 This Operation Permit is effective for the period stipulated herein, **March 01, 2021 to February 28, 2026**; unless otherwise modified, varied, suspended, or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of this Permit or the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- 6.14 This Permit must be renewed by submitting a completed *Application Form for Renewal of Environmental Authorisation* to the Agency at least six months before this Permit expires, that is, no later than **August 31, 2025**.
- 6.15 Any late submission of renewal application (s) after the specified date as stated above, shall require the Permit Holder to pay, in addition to renewal fee, a late penalty fee (accruing at the time such obligation was first owed for renewal) at a rate of **two thousand dollars (GY\$2000.00) per day** for every day late, until such renewal application is submitted to the Agency, without prejudice to any other rights of the Permit Holder in connection therewith.
- 6.16 Failure to comply with the requirements of this Permit or with applicable laws and regulations, whether existing or forthcoming, shall render the Permit Holder liable to prosecution and to penalties, inclusive of civil penalties, injunctive relief and imprisonment, as prescribed under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana and the

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Environmental Protection Regulations and any other applicable Laws of Guyana relevant to the project, whether existing at the time this Permit becomes effective or during the life of the Permit.
