Mr. Silas Campbell hereinafter referred to as the "Permit Holder", is hereby authorised in accordance with the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000, to undertake logging within SFA Bce 03/85, located at Left Bank Canje River, Northern side Torani Canal, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", in the manner indicated in the Application submitted on March 24, 2021, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein and any existing or forthcoming regulations made under the said Environmental Protection Act and/or any other applicable laws, best practices, guidelines and standards relevant to this project.

The Permit Holder, His Servants, Agents, and/or Sub-Contractors shall comply with the following Terms and Conditions:

1.0 OPERATION

- 1.1 Make an application to the Agency to vary this Permit in instances where it becomes necessary to:
 - I. Changes in construction, structure, layout of the facility;

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- Installation of new and/or changes to equipment, machine, II. apparatus, mechanism, system, or technology serving the facility or operation:
- Any technology used or installed at the facility from which effluent III. may be emitted from; and
- IV. Any other variance prescribed by Regulation 20(3) of the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations.
- Submit to the Agency the renewed State Forest Authorization 1.2 Agreement within three months of the issuance of this Environmental Permit; failing which, the EPA reserves the right to order the cessation of all activities at the Project site.
- Construct camps, roads, log markets, plumbed toilets/pit latrines, and 1.3 trail(s) in the manner specified in the Guyana Forestry Commission (GFC) Guidelines for Forest Operations, 2018.
- Ensure that adequate provisions are in place for ingress to and egress from 1.4 the Project site.
- Where the land surface has been disturbed during/after construction, 1.5 expansion, modification, or repair of the operation or any portion of the operation, the Permit Holder shall reclaim/rehabilitate the surface of the land to its former state; except where it is not possible, the Permit Holder may reclaim and/or rehabilitate unused land to an equivalent standard.
- 1.6 Discharge logs safely through the use of appropriate equipment i.e. log extractor at log market/s to ensure logs do not free fall from haulers to the ground, resulting in vibration and excessive damage to soils and/ or vegetation.
- Prohibit the hunting, trapping, and trading of endangered and locally 1.7 protected wildlife species, in keeping with the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act, 2016. Further, prohibit the capture, trading, and removal of wildlife by employees and/or all third-party contractors.

EMPLOYEES 2.0

- 2.1 Adhere to the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act, Cap. 99:01, Laws of Guyana.
 - Provide employees with the necessary protective equipment to fit their job specifications.
 - 2.1.2 Provide first aid kit/s equipped according to the Guyana Red Cross standards which shall include a snake bite kit.

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- 2.1.3 Provide communication and transportation systems to respond to emergencies.
- 2.2 Make all employees/third-party contractors aware of the Conditions of this Environmental Permit and provide training on good environmental management practices. Prepare and maintain a training file for employees which should be available upon Officers' request during Compliance Inspections.

3.0 WASTE MANAGEMENT

Comply with the provisions of the Environmental Protection (Litter **Enforcement) Regulations, 2013.**

- Maintain good housekeeping, sanitary and hygienic practices, and the good aesthetic quality of your surroundings.
- 3.2 Promote proper solid waste management practices at the Project site. Provide covered garbage receptacles at strategic locations around Concession. All solid waste collected in these receptacles must be appropriately stored, until such time, for disposal in solid waste pits. Reuse, recycle, and compost waste materials as far as practicable.
- A Solid Waste Pit should be constructed at least 100 metres away from waterways, above the water table, and lined with at least 1.5 metres of clay/loam material to avoid leachate entering the groundwater.
 - Storm water should be diverted from the waste pits. Pits should be 3.4.1 maintained and covered on a regular basis to avoid fly and rodent infestations, as well as, mal-odours from leachate.
 - When the maximum capacity is reached, the solid waste pit should be covered with at least 0.3 metres of soil, and a suitable site determined for another.

4.0 AIR QUALITY AND NOISE MANAGEMENT

Adhere to the Environmental Protection (Air Quality) Regulations, 2000, and the Environmental Protection (Noise Management) Regulations, 2000.

4.1 Comply with the Guyana National Bureau of Standards (GNBS) Guidelines for noise emission into the environment, not exceeding the limits below at a distance of 15m (50 ft) from the source or property boundary, whichever is closer.

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• Industrial Limits: 100dB (Day-time (06:00 h - 18:00 h))

- 4.2 Ensure all equipment and machinery are placed on foundations properly designed to ensure effective damping of vibrations.
- 4.3 Implement all possible measures such as ensuring equipment is serviced and operated according to the manufacturer's recommendations to minimise the impact of sound levels on the environment.
- 4.4 Ensure that mechanical equipment and vehicles are regularly maintained and work at their optimal levels to minimise atmospheric emissions.

5.0 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Adhere to the provisions of the Environmental Protection (Hazardous Wastes Management) Regulations 2000.

- There shall be no release of any pollutants (i.e. fuel, waste oil, wood preservatives) to groundwater or soil from permitted installation. Accidental release of pollutants to soil and groundwater must be recorded and reported **within 24 hrs** to the Agency for further investigation.
- Take the necessary precautionary measures such as the use of leak-proof and tightly closed containers during the transport of fuel to the concession. Appropriate measures should also be taken during the handling and use of all Hazardous Waste at the concession.
- 5.3 Store waste oil in tightly covered plastic pails to avoid spillage. Where possible, ensure it is stored on an impervious surface. It is an offence to drain fuel/lubricants including waste oils of any quantity from equipment onto the ground, drains, or waterways.
- 5.4 Promote the reuse of waste oil, for example, lubrication of equipment, where practical.
- 5.5 Label and store before being reused or sold to an authorised dealer; waste oil, used batteries, oily rags, filters, and oil containers, in a designated area with an impervious surface.

6.0 COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND REPORTING

6.1 Comply with any lawful directions given by the EPA from time-to-time in furtherance of the implementation of any international or other obligation for the environmental protection of Guyana.

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- 6.2 Monitor the implementation of the Conditions of this Environmental Permit (Renewed), insofar as they involve adherence by your employees and all third parties under your direction.
- 6.3 Submit to the EPA, the Environmental Annual Reports on the status of the project, progress of the implementation of the monitoring activities and compliance with the conditions contained herein by **March 31** every year.
- 6.4 Conform to all terms and conditions under which this Environmental Permit (Renewed) is granted and the Permit Holder shall be liable for any loss or damage which arises from the project as a result of the Permit Holder's activities or breach of any term or condition of this Permit.
- 6.5 Inform the Agency prior to or within **thirty (30) days** of any change of name or ownership of the operation.
- Notify the Agency within twenty-one (21) days in event of death, bankruptcy, liquidation or receivership of the Permit Holder or if the Company becomes a party to an amalgamation.
- Notify the EPA within one (1) hour of the occurrence of any environmental emergencies such as a sudden onset disaster, accident, natural, technological or human-induced factors that cause or threaten to cause severe environmental damage as well as harm to human health or livelihood.
- 6.8 Report to the Agency any non-compliance with the Environmental Permit (Renewed) as follows:
 - 6.8.1 Within twenty-four (24) hours of the time the Permit Holder becomes aware of the non-compliance, and the anticipated manner in which it may endanger human health or the environment.
 - 6.8.2 Within **seventy-two (72) hours**, submit to the Agency a written report containing a description of the noncompliance, its cause and the period of non-compliance including exact dates and time.
 - Submit a report to the Agency indicating the reasons and the anticipated time it is expected to continue if the noncompliance has not been corrected.

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INSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY/LIABILITIES 7.0

- The Permit Holder shall be liable for any serious environmental harm caused by polluting the environment, pursuant to s. 39 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.2 The Permit Holder shall be liable for discharging, causing or permitting the entry into the environment, of any contaminant in any amount, concentration or level excess of that prescribed by the regulations or stipulated by this Environmental Permit (Renewed), pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- The Permit Holder shall be liable to compensate any person who suffers any loss or damage as a result of contravening conditions 7.1 and 7.2 of this Environmental Permit (Renewed), pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- The Permit Holder shall be liable of any gross negligence or willful misconduct caused by the Permit Holder, his Servants and/or Agents, to the environment, biodiversity, protected species and natural habitat with respect to any release, discharge, or spill, of contaminant fluids, oil or lubricants.
- Should the Permit Holder contravene or be likely to contravene any condition of this Permit, the Agency (EPA) may serve on him an Enforcement Notice in accordance with Section 26 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.6 Where it appears to the Agency that the Permit Holder is engaged in any activity that may pose a serious threat to natural resources or the environment, or a risk of serious pollution of the environment or any damage to public health, the EPA may issue to the Permit Holder a Prohibition Notice, which may order him to immediately cease the offending activity, in accordance with Section 27 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- The EPA reserves the right to conduct regular inspections of the Permit Holder's activities as part of its monitoring and enforcement requirements under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap 20:05, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- The EPA has the right to modify, cancel or suspend this Permit for breach of any of the terms and conditions contained herein.

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I hereby accept the above Terms and Conditions upon which this Environmental Permit is granted and agree to abide by the Environmental Protection Act, Cap.20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, the Environmental Protection Regulations, 2000, and any forthcoming regulations and standards made under this Act.

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- 7.9 This Environmental Permit is not the final consent; all relevant Permissions should be obtained from other regulatory bodies for continued operation.
- 7.10 This Environmental Permit is effective for the period stipulated herein; March 2023 to February 2028.
- 7.11 This Environmental Permit shall remain valid until **February 29, 2028,** unless otherwise suspended, cancelled, modified, or varied, in accordance with the provisions of this Permit or the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- 7.12 This Permit must be renewed by submitting a completed Application Form for Renewal of Environmental Authorisation to the Agency at least six months before this Permit expires, that is, no later than **August 31**, **2027**.
- 7.13 Any late submission of renewal application (s) after the specified date as stated above, may require the Permit Holder to pay, in addition to renewal fee, a late penalty fee (accruing at the time such obligation was first owed for renewal) at a rate of **two thousand dollars (GY\$2000.00) per day** for **every business day late**, until such renewal application is submitted to the Agency, without prejudice to any other rights of the Permit Holder in connection therewith.
- 7.14 Failure to comply with the requirements of this Permit or with applicable laws and regulations, whether existing or forthcoming, shall render the Permit Holder liable to prosecution and to penalties, inclusive of civil penalties, injunctive relief and imprisonment, as prescribed under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Regulations and other applicable Laws of Guyana.
