Mr. Ganesh Cheddie, trading and operating under the name G and I Sawmills and Logging, hereinafter referred to as the "Permit Holder", is hereby authorised in accordance with the Environmental Protection Act, Cap 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000, to operate a Sawmill, at 30, Klien Pouderoyen, West Bank Demerara, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", in a manner indicated in the Renewal Application submitted on December 27, 2024, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, existing and/or forthcoming regulations made under the said Act, and/or any other applicable laws, best practices, guidelines and standards relevant to this project.

This Environmental Permit (Renewed) is issued pursuant to the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.

The Permit Holder, His Servant, Agents and/or Sub-Contractors shall comply with the following Terms and Conditions for the Operation:

1.0 OPERATION

1.1 Make an application to the Agency to vary the Permit in instances where it

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becomes necessary to:

- i. change the construction, operation, structure, or layout of the facility and all associated buildings;
- ii. change equipment, machine, apparatus, mechanism, system or technology serving the facility;
- iii. change the position and design of any outlet at the point or points of discharge of effluents; or
- iv. effect any other change outlined in 20(3) of the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations.
- 1.2 Reclaim/rehabilitate the land to its former state where the land surface has been disturbed during/after construction, expansion, modification or repair of the Sawmill or any portion of the Sawmill.
- 1.3 Loading and offloading of lumber and logs shall take place between **06:00** h **to 18:00** h to minimize disturbance to residents.
- 1.4 Discharge logs safely through the use of appropriate equipment i.e., log extractor at the Sawmill to ensure logs do not free fall from haulers to the ground causing vibration and excessive damage to soils and/or vegetation.
- 1.5 Ensure that adequate provisions are in place for ingress and egress to the site.

2.0 EMPLOYEES

- 2.1 Adhere to the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act, Cap. 99:01, Laws of Guyana.
 - 2.1.1 Provide employees with the necessary protective equipment to fit their job specification.
 - 2.1.2 Provide first aid kit/s equipped according to the Guyana Red Cross standards which shall include a snake bite kit.
- 2.2 Provide communication and transportation systems to respond to emergencies.
- 2.3 Make all employees/third party contractors aware of the Conditions of the Environmental Permit (Renewed) and provide training on good environmental management practices. A training report shall be kept and submitted upon Officers' request during a Compliance Inspection.

3.0 WASTE MANAGEMENT

3.1 Comply with the provisions of the Environmental Protection (Litter Enforcement) Regulations, 2013, where applicable.

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- 3.2 Maintain good house-keeping, sanitary and hygienic practices and the aesthetic quality of your surroundings at all times.
- 3.3 Mills that are not equipped with an extractor system or dust collection bag, remove sawdust from the mill floor in a timely manner.
- 3.4 Maintain a dust containment bin to store all wood waste (sawdust and shavings).
- 3.5 Promote proper solid waste management and disposal practices on site.
 - 3.5.1 Place covered garbage receptacles at strategic locations at the facility.
 - 3.5.2 Waste shall be collected and disposed at an approved waste disposal facility.
 - 3.5.3 Waste shall not be disposed in or near the waterways.
- 3.6 Promote waste reduction and reuse. Wood waste such as sawdust, shaving, wood ends, etc. shall be recovered and or reused. Reuse options include the following but are not limited to:
 - i. Poultry bedding;
 - ii. Mulching for gardens, highway verges, and agriculture;
 - iii. Wood pellets;
 - iv. Fuel briquettes; and
 - v. Landfill.

4.0 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

- 4.1 Adhere to the provisions of the Environmental Protection (Hazardous Waste Management) Regulations, 2000 as follows:
 - 4.1.1 There shall be no release of any pollutants (i.e., fuel, waste oil, wood preservatives) to ground water or soil from the facility.
 - 4.1.2 An incident spill report shall document **EVERY** occurrence of spills during collection and/or transportation of hazardous waste. A copy of the spill report shall be submitted to the Agency **within twenty-four** (24) hours of the incident.
 - 4.1.3 Use leak-proof and tightly closed containers to transport fuel to the Project site, and take precautions during handling and use of all Hazardous Waste.
 - 4.1.4 Store waste oil in tightly covered drums or barrels to avoid spillage. It is an offence to drain fuel/lubricants including waste oils of any

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quantity from equipment onto the ground, drains or in waterways.

- 4.1.5 Promote the reuse of waste oil, for example, as lubricant for equipment, where practical.
- 4.1.6 Label all waste oil, used batteries, oily rags, filters and oil containers, and store them in a containment bund with an impervious surface until reuse or sale to an authorised dealer.

5.0 AIR QUALITY AND NOISE MANAGEMENT

- 5.1 Comply with the provisions of the Environmental Protection (Air Quality) Regulations, 2000 and the Environmental Protection (Noise Management) Regulations, 2000.
- 5.2 Comply with the Guyana National Bureau of Standards (GNBS) Guidelines for noise emission into the environment, not exceeding the limits below at a distance of 15m (50 ft) from the source or property boundary, whichever is closer.
 - Commercial Limits: 80 dB (Day-time (06:00 h 18:00 h))
- 5.3 Enclose all sound-making devices, e.g., generators in suitable structures constructed with materials of good noise insulation properties (e.g., hollow concrete blocks, insulation boards, solid clay bricks), and equipped with silencers or mufflers to reduce the noise level.
- 5.4 Place all equipment on foundations properly designed to ensure effective damping of vibrations.
- 5.5 Service and operate equipment according to manufacturer's recommendations to minimise the impact of sound levels on the environment.
- 5.6 Take all reasonable precautions to prevent wood dust from becoming airborne.
- 5.7 Maintain vegetative buffers at the perimeter of the project site to aid in the attenuation of fugitive noise and dust.

6.0 COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND REPORTING

6.1 Comply with any lawful directions given by the EPA from time-to-time in furtherance of the implementation of any international or other obligation for the environmental protection of Guyana.

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- 6.2 Monitor the implementation of the conditions of this Environmental Permit (Renewed), insofar as they involve adherence by your employees and all third parties under your direction.
- 6.3 Submit an **Annual Report** to the EPA on your compliance with this Environmental Permit (Renewed) on or before **March 31**, **each year**.
- 6.4 Notify the Agency in writing of any change of name or ownership of the Permit Holder's facility within **thirty (30) days** after the change occurs.
- 6.5 Notify the Agency **within twenty-one (21) days** in event of death, bankruptcy, liquidation or receivership of the Permit Holder or if the Company becomes a party to an amalgamation.
- 6.6 Notify the Environmental Protection Agency within one (1) hour of the occurrence of any environmental emergencies (e.g., oil spills, hazardous materials/wastes spill, sudden onset disaster, natural, technological or human-induced factors that cause or threaten to cause severe environmental damage as well as harm to human health or livelihood).
- 6.7 Report to the Agency any non-compliance with the Environmental Permit (Renewed):
 - i. Within **twenty-four (24) hours** of the time the Holder of the Environmental Permit (Renewed) becomes aware of the non-compliance outlining the anticipated manner in which human health or the environment may be impacted.
 - ii. Within **seventy-two (72) hours** of the time the Holder of the Environmental Permit (Renewed) becomes aware of the non-compliance, submit to the Agency a written report containing a description of the non-compliance, its cause, the period of non-compliance including exact dates and time and the anticipated time it is expected to continue if the non-compliance(s) has not been corrected.

7.0 INSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY/LIABILITIES

- 7.1 The Permit Holder shall be liable for any material environmental harm caused by polluting the environment, pursuant to s. 39 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.2 The Permit Holder shall be liable for any activity that causes or is likely to cause pollution of the environment unless all reasonable and practicable measures

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- are taken to prevent or minimize any resulting adverse effect, pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.3 The Permit Holder shall be liable for discharging, causing or permitting the entry into the environment, of any contaminant in any amount, concentration or level excess of that prescribed by the regulations or stipulated by this Environmental Permit (Renewed), pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.4 The Permit Holder shall be liable to compensate any person who suffers any loss or damage as a result of contravening conditions 7.2 and 7.3 of this Environmental Permit (Renewed), pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.5 The Permit Holder shall be liable of any gross negligence or willful misconduct caused by the Permit Holder, his Servants and/or Agents, to the environment, biodiversity, protected species and natural habitat with respect to any release, discharge, or spill, of contaminant fluids, oil or lubricants.
- 7.6 Should the Permit Holder contravene or be likely to contravene any condition of this Permit, the Agency (EPA) may serve on him an Enforcement Notice in accordance with Section 26 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.7 Where it appears to the Agency that the Permit Holder is engaged in any activity that may pose a serious threat to natural resources or the environment, or a risk of serious pollution of the environment or any damage to public health, the EPA may issue to the Permit Holder a Prohibition Notice, which may order him to immediately cease the offending activity, in accordance with Section 27 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 7.8 The EPA reserves the right to enter at any time the permitted facility and conduct regular inspections of the Permit Holder's activities as part of its monitoring and enforcement requirements under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap 20:05, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- 7.9 The EPA has the right to modify, cancel or suspend this Permit for breach of any of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 7.10 This Environmental Permit (Renewed) is not the final consent; all relevant Permissions should be obtained from other regulatory bodies for continued operation.

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- 7.11 This Environmental Permit (Renewed) is effective for the period stipulated herein; **May**, **2025** to **April**, **2028**.
- 7.12 This Environmental Permit (Renewed) shall remain valid until **April 30**, **2028**, unless otherwise suspended, cancelled, modified or varied, in accordance with the provisions of this Permit or the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- 7.13 This Permit must be renewed by submitting a completed Application Form for Renewal of Environmental Authorisation to the Agency at least six months before this Permit expires, that is, no later than **October 30**, **2027**.
- 7.14 Any late submission of renewal application (s) after the specified date as stated above, may require the Permit Holder to pay, in addition to renewal fee, a late penalty fee (accruing at the time such obligation was first owed for renewal) at a rate of **two thousand dollars (GY\$2000.00) per day for every business day late**, until such renewal application is submitted to the Agency, without prejudice to any other rights of the Permit Holder in connection therewith.
- 7.15 Failure to comply with the requirements of this Permit or with applicable laws and regulations, whether existing or forthcoming, shall render the Permit Holder liable to prosecution and to penalties, inclusive of civil penalties, injunctive relief and imprisonment, as prescribed under the Environmental
