New Vision Labs Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Permit Holder", is hereby authorised in accordance with the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000, to Operate the COVID- 19 Testing Laboratory at 27 Hadfield Street, Georgetown, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", in a manner indicated in the Application for Renewal of an Environmental Authorisation submitted on May 16, 2022, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, existing and/or forthcoming Regulations made under the said Act, and/or any applicable laws, guidelines, best practices and standards relevant to this project.

This is a Renewal of Environmental Permit, Reference No: 20210519-TRMLP issued on November 24, 2021 and expiring October 31, 2022.

The Permit Holder, His Servants, Agents and/or Sub- Contractors shall comply with the following Terms and Conditions for Operation:

1.0 OPERATION

- 1.1 Make an application to the Agency to vary this Permit in instances where it becomes necessary to:
 - i. change the construction, operation, structure, or layout of the facility and all

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associated buildings;

ii. change equipment, machine, apparatus, mechanism, system or technology serving the facility;

iii. change the position and design of any outlet at the point or points of discharge

of effluents; or

- iv. effect any other change outlined in 20(3) of the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations.
- Emergency spill cleanup kits shall be maintained at the facility. Kits shall contain absorbent materials and other appropriate tools for clean-up. Spills should be cleaned-up by the Best Available Technology (BAT).
- 1.3 Fire prevention and control equipment shall be maintained in accordance with Guyana Fire Service Approval.
- 1.4 Make all employees, and third parties under your direction, aware of the conditions of the Environmental Authorisation and provide training on good environmental practices. Annual training records shall be maintained on-site and made available to the EPA upon request.
- 1.5 Adhere to the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act, Cap. 99:01, Laws of Guyana.

2.0 WASTE MANAGEMENT

- 2.1 In accordance with the Environmental Protection (**Litter Enforcement**) **Regulations 2013**, promote good sanitation and solid waste disposal practices on site. Place covered garbage receptacles, each on an impervious base and at a strategic location, within and outside the storage facility.
- 2.2 Burning of solid waste **is strictly prohibited**. All solid waste shall be disposed of by an EPA-Authorised Waste Disposal Company.
- 2.3 Good house-keeping, sanitary, and hygienic practices shall be maintained at all times. The facility's drains and surroundings shall be kept free of vegetation and litter.
- 2.4 Waste collection areas shall be kept clean. Dry methods shall be used when cleaning around waste handling and disposal areas (e.g., sweeping, use of absorbents).

3.0 BIO-HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT

3.1 Adhere to the provisions of the Environmental Protection (**Hazardous Waste Management**) Regulations, 2000.

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- 3.2 All waste mixed or contaminated with medical waste shall be treated as biohazardous waste.
- 3.3 An Occupational Safety, Health and Environmental Management Training Schedule for staff involved in the collection, storage and handling of bio-hazardous waste shall be maintained and made available to the EPA upon request.
- 3.4 Bio-hazardous wastes shall be identified and segregated according to category, at the point of generation.
- 3.5 Maintain labeling and color coding of bio-hazardous wastes.
- 3.6 Bio-hazardous waste containers must adhere to the following particulars of appropriate labeling:
 - i. Name (location);
 - ii. Date:
 - iii. Type of Waste;
 - iv. List of Content; and
 - v. Quantity.
- 3.7 Storage of Bio-hazardous waste shall **not exceed thirty (30) days**. The thirty-day period commences when the first item is placed into the designated storage container.
- 3.8 All bio-hazardous wastes shall be collected, treated and disposed of by an EPA authorised waste disposal facility. Bio-hazardous waste treatment and disposal shall be documented on a **Waste Manifest Form** which must submitted to the EPA as a component of the **Annual Report**.

4.0 COMPLIANCE MONITORING AND REPORTING

- 4.1 Notify the Environmental Protection Agency within one (1) hour of the occurrence of any environmental emergencies (e.g. oil spills, biohazardous materials/wastes spill, sudden onset disaster, natural, technological or human-induced factors that cause or threaten to cause severe environmental damage as well as harm to human health or livelihood).
- 4.2 Monitor the implementation of the conditions of this Permit, insofar as they involve adherence by your employees and all third parties under your direction.
- 4.3 Notify the Agency in writing of any change of name or ownership of the Permit Holder's facility within **thirty (30) days** after the change occurs.
- 4.4 Notify the Agency **within twenty-one (21) days** in event of death, bankruptcy, liquidation or receivership of the Permit Holder or if the Company becomes a party to an amalgamation.

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- Submit an **Annual Report** to the EPA on your compliance with this Permit on or 4.5 before March 31, each year.
- Report to the Agency any non-compliance(s) with the Environmental Permit: 4.6
 - i. Within twenty-four (24) hours of the time the Holder of the Environmental Permit becomes aware of the non-compliance outlining the anticipated manner in which human health or the environment may be impacted.
 - Within seventy-two (72) hours of the time the Holder of the Environmental Permit becomes aware of the non-compliance, submit to the Agency a written report containing a description of the non-compliance, its cause, the period of non-compliance including exact dates and time and the anticipated time it is expected to continue if the non-compliance(s) has not been corrected.
- Comply with any lawful directions given by the EPA from time-to-time in furtherance 4.7 of the implementation of any international or other obligation for the environmental protection of Guyana.
- It is the responsibility of the Permit Holder to ensure the permitted activity and 4.8 premises are secured and that all practicable steps necessary to prevent fires, explosions, leaks or suspected leaks and spills at the permitted premises are taken.

INSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY/ LIABILITIES 5.0

- The EPA reserves the right to conduct regular inspections of the Permit Holder's 5.1 operation as part of its monitoring and enforcement requirements under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection Regulations, 2000.
- The Permit Holder shall be liable for any material environmental harm caused by 5.2 polluting the environment, pursuant to s. 39 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- The Permit Holder shall be liable for any serious environmental harm caused by 5.3 polluting the environment, pursuant to s. 39 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- The Permit Holder shall be liable for any activity that causes or is likely to cause 5.4 pollution of the environment unless all reasonable and practicable measures are taken to prevent or minimize any resulting adverse effect, pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.



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- 5.5 The Permit Holder shall be liable for discharging, causing or permitting the entry into the environment, of any contaminant in any amount, concentration or level in excess of that prescribed by the regulations or stipulated by this Environmental Permit (Renewed), pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 5.6 The Permit Holder shall be liable to compensate any person who suffers any loss or damage as a result of contravening conditions 5.4 and 5.5 of this Environmental Permit (Renewed), pursuant to s. 19 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 5.7 The Permit Holder shall not be indemnified by the Agency for any activity that causes or is likely to cause pollution to the environment, resulting from adverse effects through the discharge, any contaminant in any amount, concentration, ultra hazardous substances, chemicals or otherwise, and shall be rendered liable to prosecution and to penalties prescribed under the Environmental Protection Act and Regulations.
- 5.8 The Permit Holder shall be liable of any gross negligence or willful misconduct caused by the Permit Holder, his Servants and/or Agents, to the environment, biodiversity, protected species and natural habitat with respect to any release, discharge, or spill, of contaminant fluids, oil or lubricants.
- 5.9 Should the Permit Holder contravene or be likely to contravene any condition of this Permit, the Agency (EPA) may serve on him an Enforcement Notice in accordance with Section 26 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 5.10 Where it appears to the Agency that the Permit Holder is engaged in any activity that may pose a serious threat to natural resources or the environment, or a risk of serious pollution of the environment or any damage to public health, the EPA may issue to the Permit Holder a Prohibition Notice, which may order him to immediately cease the offending activity, in accordance with Section 27 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana.
- 5.11 The EPA reserves the right to conduct regular inspections of the Permit Holder's construction activities as part of its monitoring and enforcement requirements under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap 20:05, and the Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- 5.12 The Permit Holder, His Servants and/or Agents shall at all times, allow entry to the permitted facility to any Officer designated by the EPA for the purposes of conducting inspections or any other legitimate business of the Agency. Pursuant to Section 38 of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, it is an offence to assault, obstruct or hinder an authorised person in the execution of his/her duty under the said Act or its Regulations and the Permit Holder shall be liable to penalties

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prescribed under paragraph (c) of the Fifth Schedule for doing so.

- The EPA has the right to modify, cancel or suspend this Permit for breach of any of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- This Environmental Permit is not the final consent; all relevant Permissions should be obtained from other regulatory bodies for continued operation.
- This Environmental Permit is effective for the period stipulated herein; November, 2022 to October, 2023.
- This Environmental Permit (Renewed) shall remain valid until October 31, 2023, unless otherwise suspended, cancelled, modified or varied, in accordance with the provisions of this Permit or the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, Environmental Protection (Amendment) Act, 2005, and the Environmental Protection (Authorisations) Regulations, 2000.
- This Permit must be renewed by submitting a completed Application Form for Renewal of Environmental Authorization to the Agency at least six months before this Permit expires, that is, no later than April 30, 2023.
- Any late submission of renewal application after the specified date as stated above, the Agency may require the Permit Holder to pay, in addition to the renewal fee, a late penalty fee (accruing at the time such obligation was first owed for renewal) at a rate of two thousand dollars (GY\$2000.00) per day for every business day late, until such renewal application is submitted to the Agency, without prejudice to any other rights of the Permit Holder in connection therewith.
- 5.19 Failure to comply with the requirements of this Permit or with applicable laws and regulations, whether existing or forthcoming, shall render the Permit Holder liable to prosecution and to penalties, inclusive of civil penalties, injunctive relief and imprisonment, as prescribed under the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Regulations and other applicable. nental Protection Asensack
