Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, Laws of Guyana, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Advance Health Care International – 1799 Section C, Block X, Diamond, East Bank Demerara

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reasons for its decision include:

1. Impacts on air quality during construction will be short-term, localised and mitigable. Stockpiling of construction materials will not be done and a dust screen will be erected around the construction site.
2. Noise pollution will be moderate and will occur predominantly during construction from equipment and heavy-duty machinery. All heavy-duty machines and equipment will have mufflers installed in mitigating noise pollution. Hence, noise emissions are not expected to exceed 90 dB(A).
3. Hazardous and non-hazardous waste will not be significant and will not pose any risk to human health and the environment. All hazardous waste will be handled in accordance with the Hazardous Waste Management Regulations 2000 and will be separated into labelled disposal bins. The waste is then stored in a secured location temporarily, which is then disposed of by a third-party disposal company.
4. The proposed project is not in close vicinity of any sensitive ecosystem and or protected areas and the nature of the activity will not have significant impacts on the ecosystem.

Please be advised that this decision does not indicate that this project is approved.
