Notice to the Public

Pursuant to Section 11(2) of the Environmental Protection Act, Cap. 20:05, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) screened the application for the grant of an environmental permit for the following proposed project:

Ministry of Education - Construction of the Guyana Technical Training College Incorporated (GTTCI) – Port Mourant, Corentyne, Berbice.

The EPA has determined that this project will not significantly affect the environment, and is therefore exempt from the requirement to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The reason for its decision includes:

1. Impacts on air quality during construction will be short-term, localised and mitigable. Stockpiling of construction materials will not be done and a dust screen will be erected around the construction site.
2. Noise and vibration will be expected primarily during the construction phase of the project, from movement of vehicles, heavy equipment and machinery usage. Noise emission are expected to be short-term, and localized.
3. No process water/effluent will be generated during the construction phase. Mobile sanitary units, facilitated by an approved waste disposal company will be used onsite during construction phase. Storm-water and sedimentation risks during construction will be localized, short-term, and mitigable.
4. Non-hazardous solid waste (domestic and construction materials) will be appropriately stored in waste receptacles and disposed of by an approved waste disposal company. Hazardous Waste will be disposed of in accordance with the Hazardous Waste Management Regulations 2000.
5. Impacts on traffic will be moderate and mitigable. A traffic management plan will be implemented to mitigate any concerns of traffic congestion.
