### **Re: Project Summary Outline**

The area is located at forty-five (45) miles Mabura Road. See map attached: The area is approximately 6,771 HA. which is equivalent to 16,732 AC.

The project entails the cutting of logs, piles and also Wallaba rejects into posts for fences using a chain saw and wallaba poles for Guyana Power & Light (G.P.L Inc) and Guyana Telephone & Telegraph Company (G.T.T).

The project will operate within the three (3) years cycle from 2024 to 2026 as per SFA Dem 07/23.

We will commence with the production of logs, piles and later in the future, with the production of wallaba posts and poles. These will be loaded onto trucks and taken to markets. There is no utility services with the exception for cellular services and solar lights will be used. In addition, a generator will be used for welding in times of mechanical breakdowns.

A pit/hole will be dug for the disposal of waste mainly food stuff. A pit toilet will be provided. There will be no manufacturing on site, etc.

The size of the project on startup cost is approximately thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000). This cost comprised of one F68 Clark Ranger Skidder and two tractors along with six employees which will be operating to produce logs. During operations, there will be an increase to an addition fifteen employees when the wallaba posts and poles will be produce.

We are projecting to produce about 160m<sup>3</sup> per month, which is equivalent to 2,000m<sup>3</sup> per year.

The project is about cutting trees and extracting same using the mentioned machinery to a ramp for storage to load unto the trucks.

The project is for three (3) years until December 2026, when we will have to renew the SFA to continue operations.

We don't foresee any potential effects on the environment as it is a simple project which entails the cutting of trees and pulling to the ramp for delivery.

Camps will be erected near to creeks of which all E.P.A guidelines will be put into effect on the waste disposal, etc.
